This copy of the Anderson Family Story has been scanned into the computer by the grandson of Dr. Anderson, Richard Holmes Anderson in the fall and winter of 2000-2001. The copy has been kept reasonably faithful to the original as to form and length of pages. The author of the these notes has been doing additional genealogical research on the family history and has made contact with a number of very distant cousins -- most in connection with the Horney family.

In addition to the contacts with the Horney family, contact has also been made with cousins on the Anderson side of the family -- most notably descendants of Thomas Anderson who is indicated to be an ancestor of the John Anderson who is the earliest ancestor listed in this story. Shirley Hagman of Pinole, California has provided me with this information which I am attempting to match up with the history presented in this story.

Since the paragraphs above were written, I have undertaken serious research into the family history. In that research I have succeeded in documenting the early Anderson roots in Maryland/Delaware and in North Carolina among the Quaker families who settled there (see Priscilla Coffin, wife of James Anderson).

I have also located other genealogical records that take the family a couple of generations further back from John Anderson and Elizabeth Horney. These early Anderson families all had settled in Kent County Delaware.

As you examine this family story please keep in mind that much of what is presented comes directly from the work Cora May Boots, Mrs. C. J. Davis and Dr. Haramont Nathaniel Anderson. It is unclear how much or if any of the events and names was actually documented or is the recollection of those who were living at the time the genealogical record was compiled.

I have been able to document the Anderson family in semi-official records available to me on-line - censuses and other genealogical trees as well as histories. I know that these are mostly secondary sources and that little in the way of primary sources has been tapped. I cannot vouch for people or events after the generation that includes my great-grandfather, Harmon Anderson and his siblings. My direct line I have been able to locate original documents and have included them with the family history on which I am currently working. I hope to be able to complete that work within the next couple of years.

For the benefit of the reader I have created an Index of names that will take you to the page where that individual is listed. I found it difficult to locate people in the original work so decided to take advantage of the new technology that permits a quick and direct indexing of the contents.

I hope you will find this genealogy of some use to you. If you find people who should be added or have corrections, please contact me.

#### FROM COLLECTOR TO READER

In 1944, Maude Anderson Davis lost her husband. I was elected to stay with her a few weeks or until she became adjusted. Many were the callers that I couldn't place correctly in the large Anderson family. And the Davis relatives were even more difficult to place. James Davis had been orphaned as a small child. He had two younger sisters. The Mother came to Iowa to be near her brothers. In time she married Phillip Lawton, who was a widower--with children, too. It became a family of yours--mine--and ours.

One evening as she tried to put folks in the proper order, we decided to chart the family. It proved remarkably accurate although we hadn't tried to fill in many dates. That record had been stored for twenty—three years. When her eldest daughter visited us a year ago she urged me to try to complete it. Seemingly there were thousands of John Andersons and there was no point at which to begin; so not much progress was made until we had the good fortune to contact Cora May Boots, 784 So. Detroit Street, Xenia, Ohio, a granddaughter of William's brother, Joseph, who had remained in Ohio.

But they removed part of their load, Soon were across and again on the road. Then came the Mississippi so broad and so deep; Could you cross on a ferry and your courage keep? They drove right on the great flat boat, And were soon across with never a jolt. They now had reached the promised land, With its forest and plains and scenery grand. It was then to Polk City they wended their way, For Preston and Abijah expected them each day. How glad they were for this haven of rest, For old friends and relatives are always best. Soon they would reach their home so new, And endure the hardships as all pioneers do. Very few settlers were here at that time;

There was no Rural Route, no railroad line.
So they got their mail from Des Moines by stage;
Their early experiences would fill many a page.
The Indians still hunted in this country new,
And you never could tell what they would do.
Then came the Civil War, with its horror and strife;

Many were the privations and trials they had,
But still they were happy, so life was not bad.

#### GENEALOGY

JOHN ANDERSON¹ and wife Elizabeth came to Ohio in 1801, apparently from the section of Pennsylvania that became Delaware. According to the census of 1850 James\* was born there in November 1786. Some of his children report that they came overland to Pittsburg and then down the Ohio River to Cincinnati. [Note also that William³ was the only son who came to Iowa by wagon the entire distance.]

The Maryland record of the Horneys shows three sons married to Rhoda, Esther and Lydia Anderson. Beside the three girls James had a brother, John Horney Anderson, who died while his family was still young (in Jay County, Indiana). His widow and family came to Iowa. Location not sure.

John Sr. served during the Revolution and James took part in the war of 1812. John died in 1816. His will was probated in Xenia and on record. He was buried on the home farm three miles east of Spring Valley. This farm was in the area of Caesar Creek.

It was bounty land received by John Gibson who died in Prince William County, Virginia. John paid \$500 for 400 acres in a deal completed November 28, 1807, after Gibson's death. Recorded in Xenia, Ohio.

## LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF JOHN ANDERSON, DECEASED

I, John Anderson, of Greene County and State of Ohio, being weak of body but of sound memory, thanks be to God for it and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die and as touching my only goods my will and desire is that they be disposed of in manner and form as follows:

My will and desire is that as much of my movable property be taken as will pay all of my just debts. Second, my will and desire is that My Wife Elizabeth Anderson keeps one hundred acres of my land with all of my part of the improvements where I now live during her natural life and my will is that my wife shall have all my movable estate after my debts and legacies hereafter mentioned are paid. Thirdly, My will and desire is that John Horney Anderson, my son, shall have two hundred acres of my land where he now lives as it is laid out. Fourthly, My will and desire is that my son James Anderson shall have one hundred acres where he new lives and the other hundred where I now live at my wife's decease, as it is now laid out. Fifthly and my will is that if either of my sons die having no heirs of their body begotten and leaving a widow, that his or their part of said land shall be equally divided between his or their widows and my other three daughters, namely Esther, Lydia and Rhoda or their heirs. Sixthly, and my will is that my son John H. Anderson shall have my Bible. Seventhly, and my will is that my son James Anderson shall have my qun and my two sons shall have all my farming utensils and tools at my wife's decease divided between them. Eighthly and my will and

desire is that Esther Horney, my daughter, shall have five dollars. Ninthly and my will and desire is that all of my movable estate that is left at my wife's decease equally divided between my three daughters namely Esther, Lydia and Rhoda. Tenthly and lastly my will and desire is that my two sons John H. Anderson and James Anderson shall be my whole and sole executors of this, my last will and testament, I witness whereof. I have set my hand and affixed my seal this ninth day of January in the year of our Lord, 1812.

WITNESSED BY: JOHN MENDENHALL WILLIAM STANFIELD

Probated in December term of court 1816, Greene County, Ohio.

The Coffyn story begins with Peter, son of Nicholas, who was born in England. Tristram Coffyn was the eldest son of Peter and Joan Thumber Coffyn. He married Diones Stevens, daughter of Robert esquire of Brixton. They came to Massachusetts in 1642 with five small children, his widowed mother and two unmarried sisters. He soon bought land up the Merrimac river. The Indians had rights but were willing to sell; their chief, Passaconaway gave his consent and there was a deed passed between which involved fourteen miles along the river for three pounds and ten shillings. That area became Haverhill. He later went back to Newberry, bought land, put in a ferry with an inn. Then he later got a good buy on a big grant near Dover. It was woodland on the Cochecho river. With his sons he established a lumber mill as he never wanted to hold land alone. Tristram had lost his faith in England in the quarrels between the king and parliament. His land holdings in England dried up. In a talk with Thomas Mayhew he found Nantucket was available so he approached Edward Starbuck, Thomas Macy and Isaac Coleman as the core of a company which bought Nantucket for thirty pounds and two beaver hats. Tristram also insisted that the local Indians be given some compensation.

With the lumber mill they had started a small ship building project. That was very convenient to ship building materials to Nantucket. Before long they had simple homes there and carried on agricultural projects and fishing. In time they began some whaling in nearby waters. It proved to be lucrative and the project grew into one of the largest. [Consult <u>History of Nantucket</u> by Alexander Starbuck.] <u>The Coffin Saga</u> by Will Gardner tells the family story from settlement of Nantucket to summer visitors. The heyday of the whaling industry is told in <u>Three Bricks and Three Brothers</u> (\$3.00). There are also whaling books for beginning readers available. WILLIAM ANDERSON<sup>3</sup> [James<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>] b. Aug. 5, 1810, first born of James and Priscilla Anderson, m. Amarilla Dinsmore in 1830 and lived in Ohio until 1856. Six children were born there before Amarilla died in 1847.

In 1848, William<sup>3</sup> married Lydia Horney b. Mar. 20, 1833, with whom he lived for forty-eight years. Eleven more children were born. In 1856 they came to Iowa driving a Conestoga wagon, typical of the Pennsylvania Dutch. He was the only one of the brothers to make the entire trip overland. At that time, Des Moines was his Post Office and nearest trading point. Many were the changes in his ninety years. Steam applied to navigation had been in use but three years when he was born. The first railroad was built when he was but fifteen years old. He was thirty-four when the first telegram was sent. Our country was at war on four different occasions during his lifetime.

## PIONEER DAYS 4

### W. T. Anderson - son of Preston $^3$

In the spring of 1855, father, with three other families started for Iowa. They shipped at Cincinnati on a steam boat, going by the Ohio River to Cairo, then to Keokuk, Iowa. From there they used teams of horses to Polk County. We located twelve miles north of Des Moines and two miles south of the present site of Polk City on the Des Moines River. We had two carpenters in the group who built our homes, made of logs. They also built a saw mill.

In 1857 my father, Preston, and Uncle Abijah sold their interests in the saw mill and came to Greene County. Uncle Abijah located on a farm near Jefferson and my father located three miles southeast. He built a log house which was later used by Hiram Hamilton as a barn.

The previous owner of our farm had left buckwheat in shocks. Each morning these would be covered with prairie chickens. Father went out with his gun and got four or five with one shot. That winter we had plenty of buckwheat pancakes and chickens to eat.

The first oxen I saw were driven by Nathan. McCuen I remember telling my father I did not know they worked cows.

In 1859 the wheat crop was a total failure due to cinch bugs. That year we lived on cornbread. Talk about hard times; you folks who did not live through the years of 1858 and '59 cannot conceive of the living in such hard times. We browned what flour we could spare for coffee and sugar was sorghum. Real sugar was out of the question.

For lights we used a pie tin with a greased rag in it. Our mothers and wives were happy to have one new calico dress a year. The kids were lucky to get one new pair of shoes each year. There was no money in circulation and I wonder how they managed to pay their taxes. To see a silver dollar was good for sore eyes. However, we had plenty of fruit; plums, crab apples and grapes. We crossed the creek to school in a log house.

In the spring of 1860 father got the gold fever. He and John Snodgrass, John Betebenner, Joe Anderson and myself rigged up two covered wagons with two cows tied behind and started for "Pike's Peak or Bust". Mother and the younger children went back to Ohio. We were on the road six or seven weeks before we reached the mountains. There we found Jim Wynkoop, Matt Custer and Mr. Moore nicely fixed in a log cabin. Soon we contracted a hundred cords of wood for a quartz mill and all went to work on the job. Joe and I did the cooking and the washing.

On September first, Wynkoop, Custer, Joe Anderson and myself started for home in two covered wagons. Dad put me in charge of Jim Wynkoop, with a little buckskin sack of gold dust which we were to exchange for coin in Omaha. When we got fairly well along we ran out

of food. At Ft. Kearney we bought some rice from the soldiers and lived on that until we got to Omaha where we traded the gold dust for coin.

From there on nothing of importance happened until the last day; our team had dwindled, down to one ox and one cow who laid down entirely given out just two miles from home. Joe stayed with the team and I ran to Uncle William's and told him our predicament. Drury took a yoke of oxen and brought us in. Two boys were mighty glad to get home.

I then went to Ohio at the first opportunity. In 1862 father met mother and us children in Chicago and we came back to Jefferson where we lived until 1865. Father built a house on our farm; now known as the Lamb farm.

Mr. Anderson then made mention of the departure of C. O. E. 39th Infantry under the command of Capt. Rippey. It was hard to see husbands and fathers leaving their wives and children. Think what the "war widows" had to contend with, left with small children to support. Neighbors did much to help each other during emergencies.

He was captured in the Battle of the Wilderness when Grant challenged Lee in northern Virginia and was retained in the scandalous prison at Andersonville for nine months. He contracted scurvey from the lack of good food and suffered from exposure. He was paroled Dec. 6, 1864 and hospitalized before being mustered out on June 23, 1865. His health was never good after that. His youngest son Haramont is now a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the Army, a flight surgeon who once served with Gen. Hap Arnold.

#### WAGON TRAIN

William Anderson, <u>John Snodgrass</u> and John Bettebenner came to Greene County, Iowa from Greene County, Ohio in three covered wagons. They started Oct. 7, 1856 (the day I was three years old) for Greene

County, Charles Snodgrass arriving three and one—half miles southeast of Jefferson on November 11.

Grandfather's big four horse wagon had bells on all the horses. These bells were of different sizes so they had different tones and were quite musical. Uncle Joe said they attracted people's attention and they would gather on streets of the towns and every little while someone would holler out "hurrah for the Pennsylvania Dutch." On account of Grandfather's wagon they took us to be from Pennsylvania. The box on this wagon was so long and the ends flared out so the bottom was lower in the center than at the end. There were two borses next to the wagon and grandfather had to ride one and drive the leader with one line.

There were ten in Grandfather's family, four of us, three Bettebenners. John Bettebenner drove one of grandfather's teams. There were no graded roads then. There was one road though a part of it was graded and called the turnpike road, and you had to pay to use it. There were toll gates every five miles. You must pay to have gates opened.

We crossed the Mississippi river on a ferry but all rivers that were not too deep they had to ford and sometimes the horses had to swim. Sloughs and swamps, however, gave them more trouble than the rivers. My mother said that some of the outfit got mired down most every day and they had to double teams and sometimes unload to get out. Father once told about grandfather getting really stuck. Snodgrass was in the lead that day and stopped but grandfather drove up behind and asked what was the trouble. Father said he didn't like the looks of it. Grandfather rode up beside him on an old horse named Mike. He said "drive to one side, I can make it". The bank was steep and steeper on the far side but grandfather plunged in and the water was more than midside on the horses. He got over until the leaders were part way out of the water and it was so muddy and slippery that he was compelled to stop. He threw his lead up over the saddle and slid down into the water which was more than waist deep. Then he called to my father and John Bettebenner to come over and help him unload.

I, Charles Snodgrass, raised the wagon cover and was ready to let loose and drop into the water when John B. happened to see me. He came and carried me across.

The others had to be carried also. Joe and I were usually together. Grandmother, as you know, was quite large, outweighing grandfather. She climbed out on a wheel and grandfather carried her on his back.

They unloaded part of the wagon and brought over another team. Thus they finally pulled the wagon out. They then took all the horses, back and hitched four onto the other two wagons and made it across. It took half of a day.

They had trouble finding places to stay at night, so they stopped early and inquired about distance to the nearest town. They seldom got from one town to another in a day, so at times tried farm homes. Even the small towns seldom had rooms even if they had a tavern, such was the number of people. The party tried to at least get rooms inside for the women and small children but sometimes couldn't. It was then that grandfather said he would never turn anyone away from his door.

They were so tired that the new location looked very discouraging and the women were ready to turn back and make the trip over again.





This indenture made the 28th day of November, the year of our lord, 1807 between John Spence and James Rud acting executors of the last will and testament of John Gibson deceased late of the county of Prince William and commonwealth of Virginia of the one part and John Anderson of the county of Greene, State of Ohio of the other part. Whereas the said John Gibson in his life time by an agreement with a certain William Stanfield of the said Greene County in the state of Ohio executed by the said John and William under their hands and seals bearing date the 25th October, 1805 in consideration of \$200 then by said William to the said John paid down and of the further sum of \$500, being paid by the said William on or before the 1st November 1807, contracted and bound himself as well by the said agreement as by his bonds on the back of said agreement dated on the same day and year therewith in the penalty of \$2000 to make and execute a deed for a tract of land on Ceasar Creek in Greene County granted to the said John Gibson by the United States by deed bearing the date of July 6, 1801 for 400 acres and whereas the said William Stanfield by writing under his hand annexed to the said agreement and bond dated Aug. 15, 1806 hath assigned the said agreement and bond to the said John Anderson party to these presents. Now this indenture witnesseth that the said John Spence and James Reed, executors of foresaid as well as by virtue of the power in them vested by the last will and testament aforesaid as in persuance of the said agreement and bond and in consideration of the sum of \$500 to them in hand paid by the said John Anderson at or before the sealings and delivery of these presents the receipts whereof is hereby acknowledged and the said William Stanfield and John Anderson thereof acquitted and discharged have bargained, sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents do bargain, sell alien and confirm unto the said John Anderson, his heirs and assigns the foresaid tract of land conveyed to the said John Gibson by the United States for 400 acres as by reference to the deed aforesaid of Record in the office of the United States, will more fully and at large appear together with all houses, buildings ways, woods, waters, water courses. Profits hereditaments and appurtences whatsoever to the said tract of land belonging or in no way appurtaining and all the


estate Right of Interest claims and property of him the said John Gibson of, in and to the said tract of land or any part thereof, to have and to hold of, in and to the said tract of land with all and singular appurtances unto the said John Anderson, his heirs and assignes forever to the only proper use and behoof of him, the said John Anderson, his heirs and assigns forever.
